The concert will also include a tribute to the great flamenco guitarist Paco de Lucía, who passed away earlier this year.

Miguel de Cervantes was a Spanish novelist, poet, and playwright, whose influence shaped the Spanish language of today. De Cervantes is best known for his classic epic novel *Don Quixote*.

The Miguel de Cervantes Anniversary Concert is led by MMI artistic director, Grammy Award-winner Javier Limón and MMI executive director Matthew Nicholl, musical director and Latin Grammy-winner Oscar Stagnaro, and voice instructor Sofia Rei.
