




West Michigan:

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



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Dual language (DL) or "immersion" program categories

One-way

1 group of students with a shared home language work to add a second language.
(English adding Spanish OR Spanish adding English)

Two-way

2 groups of students with different home languages work together to add the language of the other group. (English adding Spanish AND Spanish adding English)

Bilingualism and biliteracy is the goal for both types of programs. The profile of the students for whom each program is designed is the difference.

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
A combined total of approximately 13,000 Latino English learners were enrolled in all the intermediate school districts lying in West Michigan.

All the one-way programs in West Michigan are designed for English-speaking students to acquire Spanish.

There are **no** one-way programs in West Michigan designed for Spanish-speaking students to acquire English.

Only about **1,000** Latino EL students in the region were enrolled in two-way programs designed to help them maintain and develop their Spanish as well as acquire English.

They represented only **1/5** of students enrolled in Spanish immersion programs.
